Cllr. David Banks informed us that the proposed flats on the old garage site would need to submit a new application.</p> <p>Junction of Buckhurst Way and London Road: the yellow lines have been painted. <p>5.</p>	<p><u>Update Reports from George:</u></p> <p>CCTV cameras have been put in Dorset Gardens, one resident has been served notice for a 1 year probation period by the housing association, and things seem to be a lot better at the moment.</p> <p><u>Raising the Panel’s profile:</u> It would appear that although Imberhorne and Baldwins & Town neighbourhood panels are well developed, other areas are not so advanced. The Town Council have put aside £200.00 grant for each of the neighbourhood panels – Imberhorne & Baldwins, Town, Ashplatts, Herontye and Worsted. None of this money has been allocated yet. We need to work with other panels to advertise that we are out there, perhaps the money should be used for leaflet printing – explaining all about the neighbourhood panels. We need to take advice on a constitution, and we need to open a Bank account with three signatories.</p> <p><u>Introduce Johannes:</u> Johannes has formed “East Grinstead Resistance” – for addressing disasters, as he feels we must focus on vulnerable people as normal people will be left to their own devices in the event of a disaster.
